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Homemade Halloween Decor

DIY Wreath for Halloween

Give your home a festive touch this fall with this DIY Wreath for Halloween. Black, orange, and purple yarn are all used to crochet a ribbon that you wrap around a metal wire wreath frame; pumpkin decorations and black flowers are added for extra decor. Create the "boo" letters with cardboard and black yarn. This wreath design is super simple to create and will definitely make your house stand apart from the rest this season.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn in black, purple and orange
- Crochet Hook (H/8 or 5 mm)
- 18-inch wire wreath frame
- 2 black flowers
- Pumpkin decorations (from the floral section of your local craft store)

Skill Level: Easy

Size:

18 inch diameter because of wreath frame

Instructions:

Crochet Ribbon Pattern:

Note: Depending on your gauge and style, your ribbon might be longer or shorter than you need. If it's just a little too short, you can unwind it then rewind it tighter. If it's too long, wind it more loosely, then tuck in the extra on the back.

Chain 130 with the black yarn.

Row 1: In the 2nd chain from the hook, work 1 half double crochet. Work 1 half double crochet in each stitch all the way down. Fasten off.

Row 2: Attach purple to the end of the previous chain with a slip stitch and a chain 1. Work 1

hdc in each stitch all the way down.

Rows 3-7: Work exactly like row two, changing colors in each row. (orange, black, purple, orange, black).

Then, you'll take the ribbon and wrap it around the frame like the picture demonstrates.



You'll then need some wire cutters to cut off the flower stems. Stick them into the stitches so it's nice and secure. Then, take the pumpkins or other decorations and fill in above the flowers. Now, it's secure enough to hang on the door, but when you go to store it the decorations may fall off of it. However, this helps make sure that the flowers won't get squished.



To make the letters, you can take a cereal box and draw letters onto it and cut them out. If you don't trust yourself to draw the letters (smile), just print them out on a piece of paper, cut them out and trace them onto cardboard.



Then, cut off a bunch of yarn and form it into a small ball, then start wrapping the letters with the yarn.

Note: This is the tedious part! Don't make the mistake of not making a ball out of the yarn and spending most of your time untangling it as it's wrapped. It looks better when you wrap the letters several times. The letters do look fuzzy and a little wonky, but that's kind of the look you want for Halloween anyway.



Boo Coasters

You can never have too many crocheted coasters, especially during the holiday season. Make a set of these festive Boo Coasters to use during the Halloween season. This is one free crochet pattern that the whole family is sure to enjoy. They're great for everyday use during October, or for special occasions such as Halloween parties, scary movie marathons, or pumpkin carving get-togethers.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Cotton Yarn
- Crochet Hook (G/6 or 4 mm)
- Yarn Needle
- Felt for Backing (optional)

Size: 4" wide x 4 ¼" high

Gauge: 4 sc = 1 inch

Notes:

1. Following Color Charts: When following a color chart, each square represents one sc. Work all odd numbered rows by following the chart from right to left and work all even numbered rows by following the chart from left to right. Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

2. Changing Colors: To change colors: when completing the stitch prior to the start of a new color, complete the stitch through until the last yo (yarn over). On the last yo, pick up new color, yo and pull through loops to complete stitch. You now have the new color on the hook and are ready to continue stitching.

3. Using Row Count Instructions: To use row counts, the number of stitches is followed by the color abbreviation. For example: Row 3 for the "B" coaster reads 4O, 5B, 4O. This means with orange, sc in the first 4 stitches, change to black and sc in next 5 stitches, change to orange and sc in last 3 sts. Ch 1, turn at the end of each row.

Instructions:

Color Chart Symbols:



“B” Coaster:

Row 1: With orange, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 1, turn (12 sc)

Rows 2 – 14: Follow either color chart or row count instructions. End off, weave in ends.

“O” Coaster: (Make 2)

Note: When making the second “O” coaster, use same instructions below, but switch the colors, and use orange as the background color and black for the letter.

Row 1: With black, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 1, turn (12 sc)

Rows 2 – 14: Follow either color chart or row count instructions. End off, weave in ends.

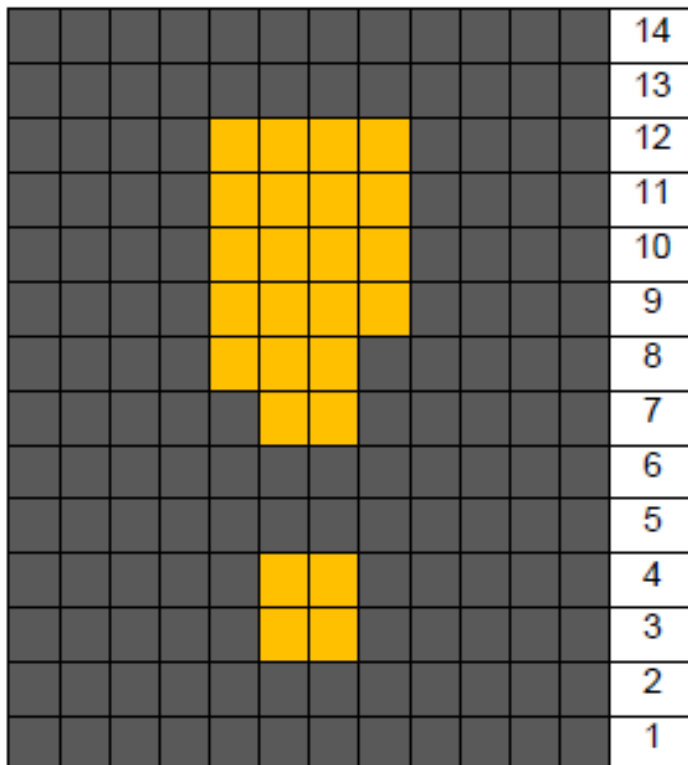

 Row 2) 12B, ch 1, turn
 Row 3) 4B, 4O, 4B, ch 1, turn
 Row 4) 3B, 6O, 3B, ch 1, turn
 Row 5) 3B, 2O, 2B, 2O, 3B, ch 1, turn
 Row 6) 3B, 2O, 2B, 2O, 3B, ch 1, turn
 Row 7) 3B, 2O, 2B, 2O, 3B, ch 1, turn
 Row 8) 3B, 2O, 2B, 2O, 3B, ch 1, turn
 Row 9) 3B, 2O, 2B, 2O, 3B, ch 1, turn

"!" Coaster:

Row 1: With black, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, ch 1, turn. (12 sc)

Rows 2 – 14: Follow either color chart or row count instructions



O = Orange / B = Black
 Row 1) 12B, ch 1, turn
 Row 2) 12B, ch 1, turn
 Row 3) 5B, 2O, 5B, ch 1, turn
 Row 4) 5B, 2O, 5B, ch 1, turn
 Row 5) 12B, ch 1, turn
 Row 6) 12B, ch 1, turn
 Row 7) 5B, 2O, 5B, ch 1, turn
 Row 8) 4B, 3O, 5B, ch 1, turn
 Row 9) 4B, 4O, 4B, ch 1, turn
 Row 10) 4B, 4O, 4B, ch 1, turn
 Row 11) 4B, 4O, 4B, ch 1, turn.
 Row 12) 4B, 4O, 4B, ch 1, turn
 Row 13) 12B, ch 1, turn
 Row 14) 12B, End off, weave in ends.

Border:

With black, join with a sl st in any stitch (I like to start at the bottom center), sc in same st as joining, *change to orange, sc in next st, change to black, sc in next st*, repeat from * to * around, working a sc in each stitch, with 3 sc in each corner. You will be changing colors on every stitch (including the 3 sc sts in each corner) to get the checkered border. After stitching the last orange sc, change to black, and join with sl st to beg sc. End off, weave in ends.

Note: You can also work the border in just one color, just sc in each st around, with 3 sc in each corner.

Optional Finishing:

If desired, the back can be covered with a small piece of felt. Cut a square piece of felt 3 ½" x 3 ¾" (or ½" smaller than your coaster). Trim each corner to round off, and using sewing thread and needle, whipstitch felt piece to back of coaster.

Spooky Spiders

Don't let the name scare you off; these Spooky Spiders are actually quite cute. Break away from the traditional black and orange color combination and use multicolored colored yarn instead. These cute spiders are fun to place around your house during Halloween; you could even string them together and hang them from the mantle. Pipe cleaners are used to make the creepy, crawly legs. For a more traditional and spooky look, make them all black instead of multicolored.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Stitch.Rock.Love Sheep(ish) by Caron: Red(ish), Lime(ish), Hot Pink(ish), Magenta(ish), Lime(ish), Black(ish)
- Crochet Hooks: (Size E/4 or 3.5 mm) and (Size G/5 or 4 mm)
- Black Safety Eyes (6mm)
- Polyester Stuffing
- Yarn Needle
- Embroidery Needle
- Black Embroidery Floss
- Pipe Cleaners (Model uses silver)

Skill Level: Easy

Instructions:

Spider:

Starting at top of head, make an adjustable ring, ch 1, and sc 6 into the ring. Pull closed.

Rnd 1: Work 2 sc into each st (12)

Rnd 2: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next st)* rep to end of round (18)

Rnd 3: (2 Sc into next st, sc into next 2 st)* rep to end of round (24)

Rnds 4-5: sc into each st (24)

Rnd 6: (Sc2tog, sc into next 2 st)* rep to end of round (18)

Rnd 7: (Sc2tog, sc into next st)* rep to end of round (12)

*Insert safety eyes and stuff spider firmly.

Rnd 8: Sc2tog around (6)

Fasten off. Use yarn tail to sew opening closed.



Using embroidery needle and black embroidery floss, embroider a "v" shape with loose stitches where the mouth belongs. Loose stitches will make the smile curve. Knot the floss and hide within the body.

Insert pipe cleaners through last rows of body.



Cut pipe cleaners in half. The standard length of a pipe cleaner is 12", so just make sure you have four 6" lengths (two pipe cleaners) for each spider. Insert each half pipe cleaner through the bottom of the spider's body and out through the other side. Bend the pipe cleaners as shown above.

Web:

With Black(ish) yarn and a G hook, crochet a chain long enough to drape across the area you wish to hang your String of Spiders. I hung mine on the mantle and chained 275 stitches. Fasten off and set aside.

ASSEMBLY

With Black(ish) and a yarn needle, thread varying lengths of yarn into the tops of the Spiders' bodies. Knot close to the surface and pull tail to pull knot inside. Tie the other end of the yarn to the Web. Space the spiders evenly across its length. Hang as desired.

*If the spiders are to be given to children as toys, please omit the safety eyes and embroider them, and use strands of yarn for the legs instead of pipe cleaners.



Trio of Halloween Cozies

Choose any one of these adorable holiday crochet patterns to use this fall. The Trio of Halloween Cozies includes the cutest monsters and ghouls you've ever seen. Let the Jack-o-Lantern, Frankenstein, or Ghostie keep your coffee warm and your fingers protected as you hand out Halloween candy this year. They are all so cute; you won't be able to pick just one. Work up all of them as decorations on your candy table and so everyone in the family can have one for themselves. What a creative way to be festive this Halloween!

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - For Jack-O-Lantern: Red Heart® Soft®: 1 ball 4422 Tangerine A, small amount 4614 Black B and 4601 Off White C.
 - For Frankenstein: Red Heart® Soft®: 1 ball 9522 Leaf D, small amount 4614 Black B, 9925 Really Red E and 4601 Off White C.
 - For Ghostie: Red Heart® Soft®: 1 ball 4601 Off White C and small amount 4614 Black B.
- Susan Bates Crochet Hook (G/6 or 4 mm)
- Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Easy

Size: Cozy stretches to fit most sizes of coffee shop cups.

Gauge: 24 sts = 5" (13 cm); 17 rows = 4" (10 cm) in sc.

Instructions:

COZY:

With A for Jack-O-Lantern, D for Frankenstein or C for Ghostie, ch 13.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, turn – 12 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in back loop only of each sc across, turn.

Repeat Row 2 until piece measures 8” (20 cm) from beginning, end with a wrong side row. Do NOT fasten off.

Joining Row: With wrong side facing and short edges aligned and working through top of last row and remaining loop of foundation ch, ch 1, slip st in each st across. Fasten off.

FINISHING:

JACK-O-LANTERN

EYES (Make 2)

With B, ch 4. Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in last ch.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew Eyes to front of Cozy. With C, embroider a small highlight in each Eye.

MOUTH

With B, ch 13.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in each of next 8 ch, hdc in next ch, sc in last sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Curve Mouth into a smile and sew in place.

FRANKENSTEIN:

NOSE

With D, ch 2.

Round 1: Work 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in first sc to join.

Round 2: Ch 1, sc in back loop of each sc around, slip st in first sc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Sew Nose to center front of Cozy.

EAR (Make 2)

With D, ch 4.

Row 1: Work 6 dc in 4th ch from hook. Fasten off, leaving long tail for sewing.

Sew one Ear to each side of Cozy.

EYE (Make 2)

With B, ch 2.

Round 1: Work 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, slip st in first sc to join.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing. Sew Eyes to front of Cozy.

With C, embroider a highlight in each eye.

MOUTH

With E, ch 17.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing.

Tack chain to Cozy in a crooked “W” shape for Mouth.

HAIR

Cut 1” (3 cm) lengths of B and attach to center top of Cozy. Trim to ½” (2 cm) for Hair.

GHOSTIE

EYE (Make 2)

Work as for Frankenstein Eye.

MOUTH

With B, ch 4.

Round 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, 3 sc in next ch, turn to work along opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, 2 sc in next ch, slip st to first sc to join.

Fasten off, leaving a 12” (30 cm) end long tail for sewing.

Sew Mouth to Cozy centered under Eyes.

Weave in ends.



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Happy Halloween Throw

Get your home ready for Halloween with this orange and black crocheted afghan. The Happy Halloween Throw will definitely add a festive touch to your living room. Kids will love curling up on the couch with this crochet blanket as they watch a scary movie or relax after a long night of trick-or-treating. This festive afghan is crocheted in strips and then sewn together. The appliques are made separately, painted, and then sewn on.

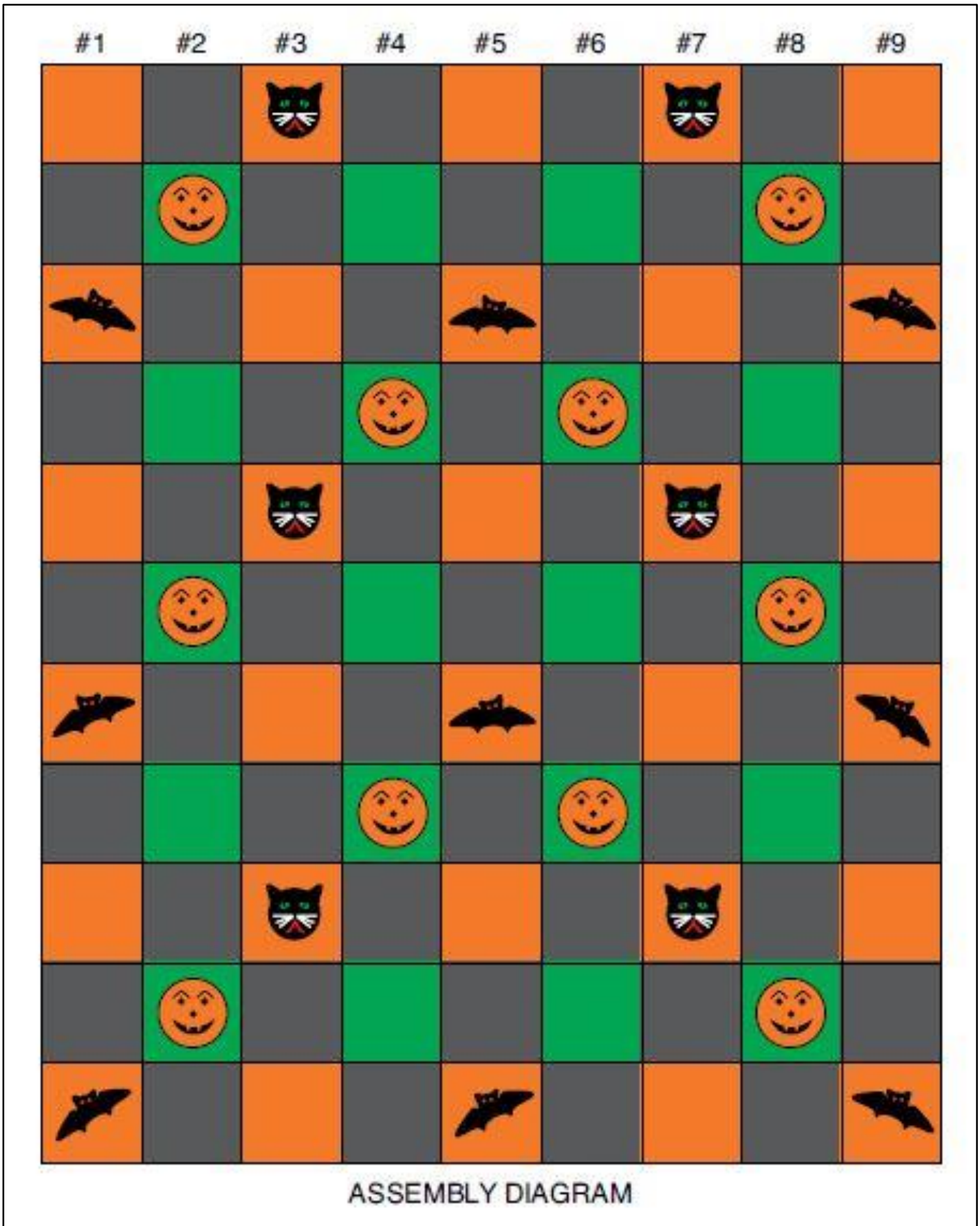
Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Red Heart Super Saver:
 - A: 4 skeins 312 Black
 - B: 2 skeins each of 254 Pumpkin
 - C: 368 Paddy Green
- Susan Bates Crochet Hook (I/10 or 6 mm)
- Yarn Needle
- Fabric Paint in red, black, green and white
- Assembly Diagram Below

Skill Level: Easy

Size: Throw measures 47" (119 cm) x 58½" (149 cm).

Gauge: 12 sts = 4" (10 cm); 14 rows = 4" (10 cm) in sc.



Instructions:

THROW

Strips 1, 3, 5, 7, 9 (Make 5):

With B, ch 16.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; turn – 15 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn.

Rep Row 2 until there are 18 rows completed.

[Change to A. Work 18 rows sc. Change to B. Work 18 rows sc.] 5 times.

Fasten off. There are a total of 11 color blocks in each strip.

Strips 2, 4, 6, 8 (Make 4):

With A, ch 16.

Row 1 (Right Side): Sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across; turn – 15 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn.

Rep Row 2 until there are 18 rows completed.

[Change to C. Work 18 rows sc. Change to A. Work 18 rows sc.] 5 times.

Fasten off. There are a total of 11 color blocks in each strip.

Sew strips together following assembly diagram (in materials list).

Weave in ends.

EDGING

Round 1: With right side facing, attach A at top right-hand corner; ch 1, 3 sc in corner, sc across top edge, 3 sc in corner, sc evenly down side, 3 sc in corner, sc across foundation ch edge, 3 sc in corner, sc up last side; join with a slip st in first sc; TURN.

Rounds 2 and 3 (Wrong Side): Ch 1, sc in each sc around and work 3 sc in center corner sc; join to first sc. TURN at end of Round 3.

Round 4: *Ch 2, slip st in 2nd ch from hook, skip next sc, slip st in next 2 sc; repeat from * around. Fasten off. Weave in ends.

APPLIQUES

Pumpkins (Make 10):

With B, ch 3; join with a slip st in first ch to form ring.

Round 1: Ch 1, 8 sc in ring; join with a slip st in first sc.

Round 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each sc around; join – 16 sc.

Round 3: Ch 1, [sc in sc, 2 sc in next sc] 8 times; join – 24 sc.

Round 4: Ch 1, [sc in 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 8 times; join – 32 sc.

Round 5: Ch 1, [sc in 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 8 times; join – 40 sc.

Round 6: Slip st in each sc around.

Fasten off.

Paint face as desired on pumpkin with black fabric paint.

Sew pumpkins on Throw following assembly diagram for placement.

Cat Face (Make 6):

With A, work same as for pumpkin until Round 4 is complete.

Round 5: *Ch 4, slip st into 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, dc in next ch, skip join, skip next 2 sc, slip st in next 6 sc; repeat from * once; slip st in each st around. Fasten off.

Paint eyes on face with green, let dry, then paint center of eye with black.

Paint nose with black, let dry, then paint whiskers with glow. Paint mouth with red.

Sew Bat faces on Throw according to diagram.

Bat Head (Make 9):

With A, work same as for pumpkin until Round 1 is complete.

Round 2: Ch 2, slip st in 2nd ch from hook – picot, skip join, skip next sc, slip st in next 3 sc, work picot, skip next sc, slip st in each st around.

Fasten off.

Paint 2 eyes on head with red.

Wings:

With A, ch 16.

Round 1: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in next ch, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next 3 ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, tr in next ch, dc in next ch, hdc in next ch, (sl st, picot, sl st) in last ch, working across opposite side of foundation ch, slip st in next 2 ch, picot, skip next ch, slip st in next 7 ch, picot, skip next ch, slip st in last 3 ch, picot.

Row 2: Working across first sts of Round 1, slip st in first 3 sts, picot, skip next tr, slip st in next 7 sts, picot, skip next tr, slip st in last 3 sts. Fasten off.

Sew head onto wings. Sew bats on Throw following assembly diagram for placement.

Halloween Costume Ideas

Fun Dragon Hat

Your kids will just love this fun dragon hat. They can wear it to school for show and tell or have an awesome addition to their homemade Halloween costume this year. They will want to be a dragon every single year as long as they get to wear this hat, all because of how fun and exciting it is! Make this perfect dragon hat for your son so that he can have one of the best DIY Halloween costumes this year.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Red Heart Super Saver1 skein each:
 - A: 672 Spring Green
 - B: 254 Pumpkin
 - C: 324 Bright Yellow
- Crochet Hook (G/6 or 4 mm)
- Polyfill Stuffing
- Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: Hat measures 18” in circumference. Fits Child’s size 2-4 years.

Gauge: 5 dc = 1½”; 3 Rounds dc = 1½”.

Special Stitch:

[AllFreeCrochet](#)

sc2tog: [Draw up a loop in next st] twice, yo and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Instructions:

Hat:

Beginning at top of hat with A, ch 4; join into a ring with slip st in first ch.

Round 1: Ch 3 (counts as dc here and throughout), 11 dc in ring; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 12 dc.

Round 2: Ch 3, dc in first st, 2 dc in each dc around; join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 24 dc.

Round 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 36 dc.

Round 4: Ch 3, dc in next dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 48 dc.

Round 5: Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, *dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc; repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3 – 60 dc.

Rounds 6-13: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3.

Round 14: Ch 1, sc in same st as joining, *skip 2 dc, 5 sc in next dc, skip 2 dc, sc in next dc, repeat from * around, join with a slip st in top of beginning ch 3. Fasten off.

Hat Scales (Make 2):

With B, ch 43.

Row 1: Sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn –42 sc.

Row 2: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sc, turn.

Row 3: Ch 1, sc2tog over next 2 sc, sc in next 2 sc, sc2tog over next 2 sc, turn.

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each st across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 1, [sc2tog over next 2 sc] twice, turn.

Row 6: Ch 1, sc2tog over next 2 sc, work 4 sc evenly spaced down side of scale.

Row 7: Sc in next 6 sc in Row 1.

Repeat Rows 3-7 (5 times); then repeat Rows 3-6 once, turn.

Joining Row: With wrong sides of hat scales together, ch 1, working through double thickness, sc evenly across top of scales, working 3 sc in top of each scale, leaving bottom open. Stuff each scale very lightly then sew scales in place on top of hat.

Tail:

With A, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join. Work in a spiral, marking beginning of each

round, moving marker up as work progresses.

Round 2: Sc in each sc around.

Round 3: *Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 8 sc.

Round 4: *Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 10 sc.

Round 5: *Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 12 sc.

Round 6: Sc in each sc around.

Round 7: *Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 15 sc.

Rounds 8-9: Sc in each sc around.

Round 10: *Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 18 sc.

Rounds 11-12: Sc in each sc around.

Round 13: *Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 21 sc.

Rounds 14-27: Sc in each sc around. Fasten off.

Tail Scales:

With B, ch 26.

Row 1: Slip st in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, *3 dc in next ch, skip next ch, slip st in next ch**, ch 1; repeat from * across, ending last repeat at **. Fasten off. Sew to top center of tail. Stuff tail and sew in place.

Large Spot (Make 2):

With C, ch 2.

Round 1: 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, do not join, work in a spiral as before.

Round 2: 2 sc in each sc around – 12 sc.

Round 3: *Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 18 sc.

Round 4: *Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc; repeat from * around – 24 sc. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length.

Medium Spot (Make 4):

Work same as Large Spot through Round 3. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length.

Small Spot (Make 2):

Work same as Large Spot through Round 2. Fasten off, leaving long sewing length. Randomly arrange spots on each side of hat and sew in place.

Princess Tiara

Let your little girl's dream of being a princess come true with this free crochet pattern. Princesses are one of the most popular Halloween costume ideas among girls, so the Pretty Princess Tiara is the perfect crochet pattern to make this year. It's quick to work up using only one skein of yarn, and adjustable fastenings make it comfortable to wear. Only a single skein of worsted weight yarn is needed to complete this crochet pattern. Pink craft beads are used as rhinestones, and they add the perfect finishing touch.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Red Heart Super Saver: 1 skein 324 Bright Yellow
- Susan Bate Crochet Hook (H/8 or 5 mm)
- Stitch-Lock markers
- Pink ¼" [0.6 cm] diameter craft beads
- 3" [8 cm] length of 5/8" [1.6 cm] sew-on Velcro®
- Sewing Needle and Thread to match yarn
- Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Easy

Size: Crown measures 4" [10 cm] high and will fit up to 20" [50 cm] circumference.

Gauge: 13 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 18 rows = 4¼" [11 cm] in sc.

Special Abbreviations:

sc2tog = draw up a loop in next 2 sts, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook.

Bead-picot = ch 1, slide bead up to hook, ch 1, enclosing bead, ch 1, insert hook under front loop and vertical bar of last sc, pull yarn through all loops.

Instructions:

Crown:

Ch 72.

Row 1 (Wrong Side): Sc in 2nd ch and each ch across; turn – 71 sc.

Rows 2 and 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc across; turn.

Row 4: Slip st in 26 sc, ch 1, sc2tog in same and next sc, sc in next 18 sc, sc2tog; turn leaving remaining sts unworked – 20 sc.

Rows 5-12: Ch 1, sc2tog over first 2 sc, sc across to last 2 sc, sc2tog over last 2 sc; turn – 4 sc at end of Row 12.

Row 13: Ch 1, [sc2tog over next 2 sc] twice; turn – 2 sc.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc2tog – 1 sc. Fasten off.

Edging:

Place marker in tip of point; starting at marker, place a marker every 1½" [4 cm] along both sides of triangle and along top of band. String beads onto yarn with yarn needle.

Row 1: With right side facing, join yarn with slip st to first slip st of Row 4, ch 1, * sc evenly to next marker, sc in marked st, bead-picot **; repeat from * to point of triangle, (2 sc, bead-picot, sc) all in point; repeat from * to end of band, end at **; sc to end of band. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Weave in ends. Using sew-on Velcro strips, sewing needle, and thread to match yarn, stitch a 3" [8 cm] strip of Velcro to each end of band, facing each other, to close back of crown.

Devil Horn Hair Clips

Add the perfect finishing touch to your Halloween costume this year with these Devil Horn Hair Clips. This easy crochet pattern is an inexpensive way to complete your outfit. It's hard not to have a sinfully good time when you look this good. They will stay in your hair so well that you can easily take your kids trick-or-treating without worrying about them falling out.

Materials:

- Small amount of size 10 crochet thread in red
- Steel Crochet Hook (Size 7 or 1.65 mm)
- Small Amount of Stuffing
- Hair Clips
- Craft Glue

Skill Level: Easy

Size: Each horn is about 1" tall.

Gauge: 4 hdc = 1\2", 4 rows = 1\2"

Instructions:

(Make 2)

With Red thread and 7 hook ch-3, sl st to form a ring.

Rnd 1: Ch-1, work 12 hdc in ring, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (12 sts)

Rnd 2-3: (2 hdc next st, hdc next st) around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (18 sts)(27 sts)

Rnd 4: Back Loop hdc ea st around, sl st top beg hdc, c h-1, turn.

Rnd 5: Hdc ea st around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn.

Rnd 6: Hdc next 2 sts, (hdc dec next 2, hdc next 3) around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (22 sts)

Rnd 7: Hdc next st, (hdc dec next 2 sts, hdc next 5 sts) around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (19 sts)

Rnd 8: Hdc next st, (hdc dec next 2 sts, hdc next 4 sts) around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (16 sts)

Rnd 9-10: (Hdc dec next 2 sts, hdc next 2 sts) around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (12 sts)(9 sts).

Stuff horn.

Rnd 11: (Hdc dec next 2 sts, hdc next st) around, sl st top beg hdc, ch-1, turn. (6 sts)

Rnd 12: (Hdc dec next 2 sts) around, sl st top beg hdc, fasten off.

Glue to hair clips or insert bobby pins.



Superhero Cape and Mask

When you just don't know what to do during playtime anymore, the Super Hero Cape and Mask will come to the rescue. Learn how to crochet these cute patterns in multiple sizes so that all of your kids can have one. The kids (and you) are sure to love the excitement they bring to both playtime and Halloween. These would make spectacular homemade Halloween costumes for sure!

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with Hobby Lobby's I Love This Yarn and Vanna's Choice
- Crochet Hook (N/15 or 10 mm)
- Tapestry Needle

Skill Level: Easy

Gauge:

Cape: 4" x 4" swatch = 4 rows of 8 dc

Mask: 2" x 2" swatch = 5 rows of 5 sc

Notes:

1. You'll be working with two strands of the color for the entire pattern unless otherwise noted.
2. The number at the end of each row is the stitch count for the row (#). Chain stitch does not count in stitch count!

Instructions:

Mask:

Using two strands of worsted weight yarn in color of choice (N- Hook)

Mask (0- 12 months)

Row 1: ch 11, sc in the 2nd chain from the hook and in the next 9 sts, ch1, turn (10)

Row 2: sc dec over the next 2 sts, ch 4, sk 2 sts, sc in next 2 sts, ch 4, sk 2 sts, sc dec over the next 2 sts, ch 1, turn (4 sc and two ch 4 spaces)

Row 3: sc in 1st sc, 4 sc in ch 4 space, sc in next 2 sts, 4 sc in ch 4 space, sc in next sc, ch 1, (13)

Row 4: sl st up the side of the mask to row 1, ch 26, turn

Row 5: sc in 2nd ch from hook, and in each chain across, join with sl st to mask, sl st across the top of row 1 to opposite corner, ch 26, sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, and in each chain across, sl st back to mask, fasten off and weave in ends.

Larger mask for 1+ years

Row 1: ch 13 sc in the 2nd chain from the hook and in the next 11 sts, ch1, turn (12)

Row 2: sc dec over the next 2 sts, ch 5, sk 3 sts, sc in next 2 sts, ch 5, sk 3 sts, sc dec over the next 2 sts, ch 1, turn (4 sc and two ch 5 spaces)

Row 3: sc in 1st sc, 5 sc in ch 5 space, sc in next 2 sts, 5 sc in ch 5 space, sc in next sc, ch 1, (13)

Row 4: sl st up the side of the mask to row 1, ch 32, turn

Row 5: sc in 2nd ch from hook, and in each chain across, join with sl st to mask, sl st across the top of row 1 to opposite corner, ch 32, sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, and in each chain across, sl st back to mask, fasten off and weave in ends.

Cape: 0-3 months

Double strands of worsted weight yarn; color of choice; N- Hook

Size: Measures 11 inches long by 10 inches at its widest (along the bottom)

Working from the bottom to top of cape

Row 1: Ch 20, dc in the 3rd chain from the hook and each ch across, ch 2, turn (18)

Row 2 -8: dc in each st across, ch 2, turn (18)

Row 9: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (16)

Row 10: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (14)

Row 11: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 1, do not turn (12)

Edging and Ties:

Sc around the cape to the opposite side of row 11 (be sure to work 2 sc in the corners on Row 1.

When you reach the opposite corner of row 11 sc 1 time, ch 20, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook and each remaining ch, sc in same st of row 11 corner,

Sc across to top of row 11 to opposite corner, working only 1 sc in that corner, ch 20, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook and each remaining ch, sc in same st of row 11 corner,
Join with a sl st to 1st sc of edging (fasten off and weave in ends)

Cape: 3-6 months

Same as 0-3 month pattern but repeat Row 2 two more times to add extra length.

Cape: 6-12 months

Size: Measures 13 inches long by 12 inches at its widest (along the bottom)

Row 1: Ch 24, dc in the 3rd chain from the hook and each ch across, ch 2, turn (22)

Row 2 -11: dc in each st across, ch 2, turn (22)

Row 12: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (20)

Row 13: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 1, do not turn (18)

Edging and Ties:

Sc around the cape to the opposite side of row 13 (be sure to work 2 sc in the corners on Row 1.

When you reach the opposite corner of row 13 sc 1 time, ch 28, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook and each remaining ch, sc in same st of row 13 corner,

Sc across to top of row 13 to opposite corner, working only 1 sc in that corner, ch 28, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook and each remaining ch, sc in same st of row 13 corner,
Join with a sl st to 1st sc of edging (fasten off and weave in ends)

Cape: 1-5+ years

Size: Measures 16 inches long by 14 inches at its widest (along the bottom)

Row 1: Ch 34, dc in the 3rd chain from the hook and each ch across, ch 2, turn (32)

Row 2 -7: dc in each st across, ch 2, turn (32)

Row 8: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (30)

Row 9 -10: dc in each st across, ch 2, turn (30)

Row 11: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (28)

Row 12: dc in each st across, ch 2, turn (28)

Row 13: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (26)

Row 14: dc in each st across, ch 2, turn (26)

Row 15: dc dec over the 1st 2 sts, dc in each st across to last 2 sts, dc dec over the last 2 sts, ch 2, turn (24)

Row 16: dc in each st across, ch 1, do not turn (24)

Edging and Ties:

Sc around the cape to the opposite side of row 16 (be sure to work 2 sc in the corners on Row 1.

When you reach the opposite corner of row 16 sc 1 time, ch 31, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook and each remaining ch, sc in same st of row 16 corner,

Sc across to top of row 16 to opposite corner, working only 1 sc in that corner, ch 31, sl st in the 2nd ch from the hook and each remaining ch, sc in same st of row 16 corner,

Join with a sl st to 1st sc of edging (fasten off and weave in ends)



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Children's Pumpkin Hat

Make a Children's Pumpkin Hat for the fall season. This fabulous burnt orange hat can be worn through the entire season and it's perfect for Halloween, too. The spiral vine part makes it a unique and fun crochet pumpkin hat for the kids. This hat is worked in both rounds and rows allowing you to practice your crochet skills. Get in the spirit this Halloween and have your kids sport their new hat.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Yarn
 - Model is stitched with I Love This Yarn in Burnt Orange and Green
- Crochet Hook (I/9 or 5.5 mm)
- Scissors
- Yarn Needle

Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: Toddler/Young child. You can adjust the pattern to fit any size by simply adding some Ch's to your foundation and some extra rows.

Note: Ch 2 does not count as a st. After row 1 you will be working in the BLO

Instructions:

Using Orange, Ch 30

Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch from hk and every ch across. Turn your work. (28) (RS of Work)

Row2-32: Ch 2, turn, Hdc in each st across. (28)

DO NOT FASTEN OFF

You should have the WS facing you after you have finished row 32. If not, simply add one more row.

With WS facing out, fold the hat in half and Sl St the last row and foundation row together.

Fasten off.

For the top of the hat:

Turn the hat RS out.

Using GREEN, attach to the top side of your hat (Use the side with the tail)

Round 1: Ch 1, evenly Sc around the top of the hat. Join with first Sc.

Round 2: Ch 1, Sc Dec all the way around. Join with first Sc.

Continue round 2 until you have about 6 sc left.

Once you have about 6 sc left, sc in each st around until you have the stem your desired length. (Stem pictured is between 2 and 3 inches long)

Fasten off

For vine (optional):

Using green, Ch 30

Starting in 3rd ch from hk, 3 hdc in each ch across.

Fasten off leaving a long tail

Using tail attach vine next to the stem.

Weave in all ends.

Free Crochet Bag Patterns for Candy

Pumpkin Candy Bag

Kids will love keeping their candy in this Crocheted Pumpkin Candy Bag. This free Halloween crochet pattern begins by making a magic circle and is worked in rounds. The handle is crocheted separately and sewn on at the end. This crocheted bag measures approximately 7 inches high and 11 inches wide when complete. If you have more than one child, add a crocheted appliqué to each one for a bit of personalization, or use different shades of orange yarn to differentiate between the bags.

Materials:

- Worsted Weight Acrylic or Cotton Yarn
- Crochet Hook (H/8 or 5 mm)
- Tapestry Needle

Skill Level: Intermediate

Size: Approx. 7 in. high and 11 in. wide.

Special Stitches:

hdc2tog: Yarn over, insert hook into designated st and pull up a loop, yarn over again and insert hook into next stitch and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through all 5 loops on hook.

FPdc: Yarn over, insert hook from front to back to front round post of specified st and pull up a loop, yarn over and pull through 2 loops, yarn over again and pull through remaining 2 loops.

Instructions:

Make a magic ring.

Foundation Round: Ch 2 (counts as st here and throughout), work 5 hdc in ring, join — 6 sts.

Round 1: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch as join, 2 hdc in each st around, join — 12 sts.

Round 2: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch as join, 1 hdc in next st, *2 hdc in next st, 1 hdc in next, rep from * around, join — 18 sts.

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch as join, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, *2 hdc in next st, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 24 sts.

Round 4: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch as join, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, *2 hdc in next st, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 30 sts.

Round 5: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in same stitch as join, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, *2 hdc in next st, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, rep from * around, join — 36 sts.

Round 6: Ch 2, working in back loops only, 1 hdc in each st around, join — 36 sts.

Round 7: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 8: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 7 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 9: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 10: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 8 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 11: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, 2 hdc in next, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, rep from * around, join — 54 sts.

Rounds 12 through 14: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 9 sts, rep from * around, join — 54 sts.

Round 15: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 4 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 16: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 8 sts, rep from * around, join — 48 sts.

Round 17: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 18: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 7 sts, rep from * around, join — 42 sts.

Round 19: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 3 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 36 sts.

Round 20: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 6 sts, rep from * around, join — 36 sts.

Round 21: Ch 2, *work 1 FPdc in hdc directly below, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, hdc2tog, 1 hdc in each of the next 2 sts, rep from * around, join — 30 sts.

Round 22: Ch 1 (does not count as st), working back across stitches just made, work 1 rev sc in each st around, join — 30 sts.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Handle:

Ch 45.

Row 1: Work 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook and each ch across, turn — 44 sts.

Rows 2 through 4: Ch 1 (does not count as st), work 1 sc in each st across, turn — 44 sts.

Fasten off.

Using the same color yarn and a tapestry needle, sew the handle to pumpkin bag. Weave in ends.



Homemade Halloween Treat Bag

Add a homemade touch to your trick-or-treating adventures this year with this Homemade Halloween Treat Bag. Your little ghosts and goblins will love toting this crocheted bag around with them as they collect their candy. The candy corn design is the perfect color combination for this festive treat bag, but feel free to use any 3 colors of worsted weight yarn you prefer. Add a decorative ribbon for a nice finishing touch. This free crochet pattern is quick and easy to work up.

Materials:

- white, orange, and yellow worsted weight cotton yarn
- Tapestry needle
- Ribbon
- Yummy Halloween treats!

Size: Approx. 6 in. high and 6 in. wide.

Instructions:

With white, make a magic ring.

Round 1: Ch 1 (does not count as st here and throughout), work 6 sc in ring, join — 6 sts.

Pull tail to close up ring and weave in to secure.

Round 2: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in next st, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 2 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 8 sts.

Round 3: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 2 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 3 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 10 sts.

Round 4: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 3 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 4 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 12 sts.

Round 5: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 4 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 5 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 14 sts.

Round 6: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 5 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 6 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 16 sts.

Round 7: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 6 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 7 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 18 sts.



Round 8: Join orange, ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 7 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 8 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 20 sts.

Round 9: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 8 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 9 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 22 sts.

Round 10: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 9 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 10 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 24 sts.

Round 11: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 10 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 11 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 26 sts.

Round 12: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 11 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 12 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 28 sts.

Round 13: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 12 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 13 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 30 sts.

Round 14: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 13 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 14 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 32 sts.

Round 15: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 14 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 15 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 34 sts.

Round 16: Join yellow, ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 15 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 16 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 36 sts.

Round 17: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 16 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 17 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 38 sts.

Round 18: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 17 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 18 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 40 sts.

Round 19: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 18 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 19 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 42 sts.

Round 20: Ch 1, work 1 sc in same stitch as join and in each of the next 19 sts, 2 sc in next, 1 sc in each of the next 20 sts, 2 sc in next, join — 44 sts.

Round 21: Ch 3 (counts as dc), work 1 dc in each st around, join — 44 sts.

Round 22: Ch 1 (does not count as st), work 1 rev sc in each st around, join — 44 sts.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Fill with Halloween treats and weave a ribbon through the dc stitches to close bag.
